

A Call to prayer

Each year there is a theme
and this year it is 'Love thy
Neighbour.'



This comes from the Passage in Luke when Jesus is asked— who is my Neighbour and tells the story of the Good Samaritan in response. The Christians of Burkino Faso have planned the themed services for 2024.

During the WPCU in Sittingbourne the churches together are hosting prayer slots throughout the week, and we are all called to join together and to pray for one another. If we use the Good Samaritan as an example, then our Neighbours might be from a different culture or back ground. They may be wounded physically or mentally, and they definitely need something that we can give.


There are a few practical things taking place over the next week or so— on Tuesday 9th Jan. all of the electrical items in the church will have their PAT test done— We like to keep

The Apostle Paul - A man on a mission

There are many characters in the Bible that stand out for completely giving themselves over to God, but very few who would go on to leave a mark on the world so profound, that evidence of life and ministry would survive thousands of years after their death.



The Bible has much to say about the Apostle Paul and in this New Year of 2024, we will begin a NEW series and explore the person of Paul, find out what his peers thought of him, and examine what God managed to accomplish through him.

We will start with a blank canvas and go on a journey of discovery; we will find out why this man had such a huge influence in his generation, and also look at the impact his legacy continues to have on much of the known world today.

An inspiration or someone to be avoided?

Who was this man? What made him so special that he should be used of God so greatly? Through studying the person and ministry of the Apostle, we can learn much

As a church

From his writings, we learn that this was a man with focus. He had an overflowing desire to live a life dedicated to his Lord and Saviour. Surely this is someone from whom we can draw much inspiration.

Not everybody liked Paul, some feared him, and some rejected him, they just didn't trust him. Many would distance themselves from him and some even sought to destroy him.

So, who were his friends, and what did they mean to him? Who were his enemies, and why did they try to silence him?

A man on a mission

What do places like Ephesus, Galatia and Philippi have in common? These are just a few places where the apostle preached during one of his three missionary journeys, and in which he planted churches. These churches received letters from Paul, letters that were inspired of God and these became part of the New Testament canon of scripture.

Paul worked hard and preached in many towns and cities. He travelled an estimated nine thousand miles on his missionary journeys alone, and that does not include his journey to Rome, nor distances walked whilst at these places.

Paul preached in many countries, including what is known in modern times as Turkey, Greece, Syria and Italy.

The modern-day missionary might seem quite different from a first century evangelists' perspective. Paul's life as an apostle and preacher was not an easy one. He was often chastised, scourged, imprisoned and stoned. Yet this man managed to remain faithful until the end. Nobody should doubt his commitment to the ministry and his faithfulness toward God.

Should Paul's legacy be accepted or rejected?

To dedicate your life to God is admirable enough, but that did not supress his detractors, they sought to silence him and even kill him.

You'd think after a few thousand years, that would be that, but you'd be wrong. Even today Paul has enemies, they still want to silence his legacy. Our study will seek to find out why Paul's writings are scrutinised, detested and divisive among many in the church today.

Come and explore together

Come along, bring your Bible and note taking materials, as we find out more about the Apostle Paul, whom many consider, one of the greatest missionaries of all time.
